Description:

Professional Child Development Associates (PCDA) will present an interdisciplinary approach to address feeding challenges in infants and toddlers, based on the DIR® framework. This approach focuses on supporting relationships between parent and child, while addressing the many possible impediments to the successful development of feeding and eating. Topics will include typical feeding development, oral-motor and neuro-muscular differences, individual sensory processing profile and health issues affecting eating, as well as the patterns of interaction between adult and child. Participants will be able to identify concerns related to eating and growth, and learn strategies to support healthy eating.

Learning Objectives:

Participants will be able to:

- 1. Explain the importance of the relationship between the parents and child in creating successful eating experiences.
- 2. Identify primary barriers to feeding development including motor challenges and sensory processing difficulties.
- 3. Identify various ways that medical conditions may influence feeding.
- 4. Interpret diet and growth data and the role of the dietician.
- 5. Identify three or more feeding strategies to support feeding progression.
